Wendy Preston

February 1940-March 2026

Wendy Eileen Preston, nee Beaton, was born on the 12th of February 1940 and lived in North London with her parents, Eileen and William, who were both from South Wales. The war years were spent with her grandparents in South Wales, but she was back in the capital for VE Day in 1945; where she sat on her father's shoulders in the crowds outside of Buckingham Palace.

After contracting tuberculosis in 1947, Wendy spent 6 months in hospital followed by 6 months in a convalescent home.

Finishing school at 16, Wendy took a Secretarial Course and got a job at NatWest Bank, but after 6 weeks, realised she would die of boredom and joined De Havilland as Assistant to the Chairman's Secretary. Here, she joined the Dramatic Society and starred in many productions.

As near neighbours, Wendy met husband John, aged 18. They married in 1961 and moved to their first Police House in South Oxley. Daughter Sarah was born in 1964, followed by Sian in 1966. In 1968, they moved to Hemel Hempstead, where John joined the CID and Wendy qualified to teach dressmaking, taking up a teaching post in a local secondary school. She finally went on to work for Warehouse Planning in Berkhamsted, where she became a director before retiring at the age of 59.

In 1988, John and Wendy moved to Prospect Close in Drayton Parslow, down-sizing 13 years ago to Fox Lane. They lived in the village for 38 years and Wendy loved being part of the community. She chaired on the Parish Council for many years and was also a Trustee and Chairman of the Village Hall. She was very proud to have raised funds for the construction of the MUGA. She started a Book Club in 2004, which is still active, and won many prizes for cooking and flowers at the local VPA Show. Wendy loved Holy Trinity Church and was on the Church PCC since arriving in the village. She organised fundraising events such as Flower Festivals, Open Gardens, Wreath Making, and Coin Jar Collection. She organised the making of the altar cloth, cushions for the pews and fundraised for the toilet extension we have today.

Wendy was very proud of her grandchildren, Emily, Felix, and Oli, and has greatly enjoyed being a Great Grandparent to Emily's children, Joseph and Clemmie. Wendy enjoyed a wonderful, full life and is now at peace. Her ashes will eventually be interred in Drayton Churchyard.



Rector's Musings & Holy Trinity Service Dates



I write this as we look forward to the Doves of Peace installation to be put up in Holy Trinity later this month. I wonder how you felt as you created your dove and then saw it in situ? In a world that often feels hurried and noisy, peace can seem difficult to find. Yet in the middle of everyday life God still offers us a deep and lasting peace.

Living in a rural village, we are lucky to have opportunities to find a moment's peace if we pause long enough to notice them. A walk across open fields,

watching lambs in springtime, or the stillness of an early morning, can all become moments of prayer and reflection. Last week as I drove home through Drayton Parslow there was a beautiful sunset across the horizon, a real wow moment. Nature has a way of slowing us down and reminding us that we are part of God's creation, if we let it!

Finding peace with God often begins with making space for stillness. That may mean sitting quietly for a few minutes each day, reading a psalm, lighting a candle, or simply taking a walk without distractions. Peace grows when we step away from constant noise and allow ourselves to listen: to creation, to our hearts, and to God. Peace can also be found in small acts of kindness and in community. Sharing tea with a neighbour, helping someone in need, playing bridge together, sitting in a knitting circle, or gathering in church, reminds us that we do not walk through life alone. God's peace is something we receive, but also something we share with others.



In John 14, Jesus speaks tenderly to His disciples as they face uncertainty and fear. He says, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives." The peace of Jesus is not simply the absence of trouble, but the quiet assurance that we are held in God's care whatever life brings. Jesus knew that life would not always be easy, yet He still offered peace. Perhaps that is the invitation for all of us: don't wait for perfect circumstances, but search for God's presence in ordinary moments and trust that His peace is near. And if you find yourself feeling overwhelmed reach out and ask others for help, ask someone to pray for you or on your behalf.

Holy Trinity church will be open between 7 and 8pm on Wednesdays until 9th September for you, should you want to spend some time in that beautiful peaceful place.

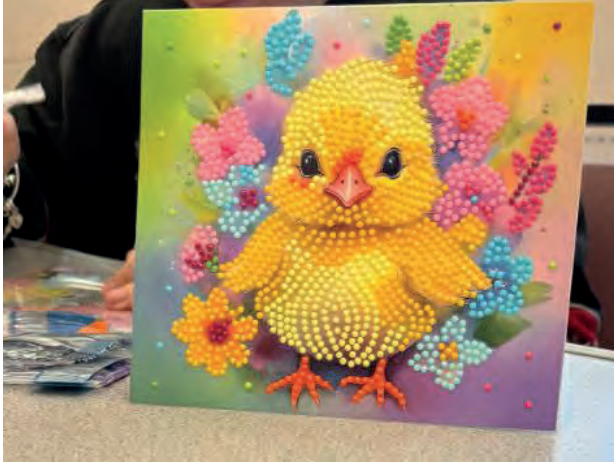


Craft and Chatter

DRAYTON PARSLOW PARISH COUNCIL NEWS Village Update – Spring 2026

Welcome to the latest update from Drayton Parslow Parish Council. The Parish Council continues to work on a range of projects across the village and we would like to thank residents for their continued support and patience whilst improvement works are carried out.

Defibrillator Kiosk Refurbishment Update

The Parish Council is pleased to confirm that refurbishment works to the former telephone kiosk have now been completed. Unfortunately, during the installation phase we encountered some unexpected issues relating to the mounting of both the defibrillator and the cabinet.

To safely complete the project, additional internal works are now required within the kiosk. The Parish Council aims to complete these works as soon as possible so that the defibrillator can be returned to its permanent location.

In the meantime, the defibrillator remains available for emergency use at Greenacre Hall.

The Parish Council would like to thank residents for their patience whilst these final works are completed.

Parish Maintenance & Village Improvements

The Parish Council has continued to invest significantly in parish maintenance and environmental improvements across the village.

We hope residents agree that the cleared banks and verges now look wonderful, particularly with the spring daffodils now in bloom. Removing accumulated debris and improving maintenance standards has made a noticeable difference to several areas of the parish, and further work is planned throughout the year.

The Parish Council would also like to thank volunteers and residents who continue to help keep the village looking its best.

Recreation Ground & Car Park Reminder

Residents are reminded that the recreation ground car park is intended primarily for users of the Social Club, Greenacre Hall, and the recreation facilities.

Unfortunately, the Parish Council has been unable to complete the planned line-painting project due to continued vehicle use within the lower recreation bays during the works period.

To help protect the surface and allow improvement works to be completed safely, the Parish Council may consider temporary access restrictions within the coming months if the issue continues.

We would appreciate residents' cooperation and understanding whilst we seek to improve parking arrangements and maintain the area for all users.

Your Garden in June



June 21st is the longest day of the year, and the extra light and warmth encourages the garden to put on an extra burst of growth. It can be a variable month, with chill nights and rain, but the chances of frost are slim and the garden may never look better; regular upkeep will ensure a long summer of interest.

Jobs for the garden:

- Hoe borders regularly to keep down the weeds
- Position summer hanging baskets and containers outside. Make sure they are well watered preferably using collected rainwater, or recycled grey water whenever possible.
- Mow the lawn weekly and apply a selective weed-killer which kill weeds but not the lawn. Be careful if you have wild flowers growing in it as it may mistake them for weeds.
- Plant out summer bedding and fill gaps in borders with annuals.
- Stake tall or floppy plants. Sweet peas can be trained onto their support to create a good display.
- Prune spring-flowering shrubs and cut back/clean and divide spring flowering perennials
- Check roses for mildew, aphid, black-spot or other insect or disease problems and if they appear, take steps to control them straight away.
- Harvest lettuce, radish, other salads and early potatoes. Earth up the rest and promptly plant any potatoes still remaining.
- Pinch out side shoots on tomatoes and tie in as required.

What is the Drayton Parslow Village Product Association (VPA)?

You will often see events and posts from the VPA but what is the VPA??

If you are new to the village you may not know who we are or what we do, so I will try and explain...



VPA stand for Village Produce Association. This group was formed during the war to help Drayton Parslow villagers grow their own food.

Following on from the war years, seeds and garden supplies were purchased in bulk and sold at a discounted price from a shed opposite the Three Horseshoes public house. This continued for many years (now you can join The Windmill Hill Allotment Society to gain the same benefits)

In more recent years the VPA has concentrated on organising events for the village and surrounding areas, raising money for different charities and also contributing to the village.
Some items the VPA has funded include:

Purchase of storage container (used to store mowing equipment at the recreation ground)
Paying for the water supply to be installed at the main road allotments
Purchasing trestle tables for community use (these are stored at Greenacre Hall)

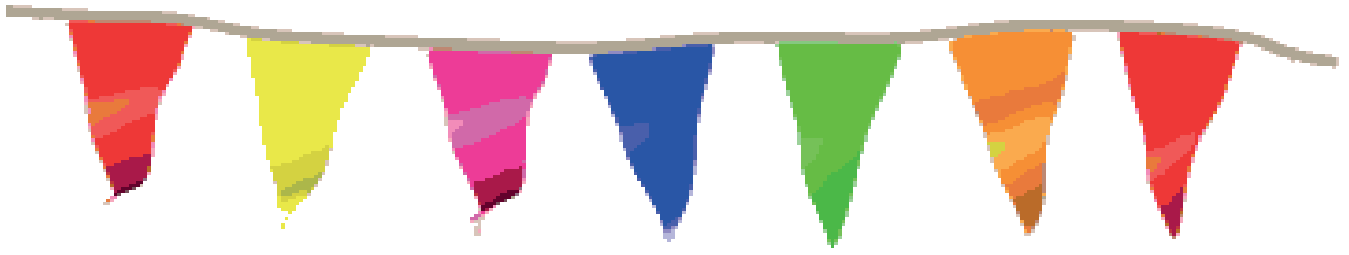
